Julie Nelson Ingoglia is a Program Manager for the Tobacco, Diabetes and Cancer Control and Prevention Projects within NACCHO's Community Health Team. On all three projects, she is engaged in capacity building and action planning activities with local health departments (LHDs) and coalitions, ensuring evidence-based and sustainable programming. Ms. Ingoglia works with a variety of partners at all levels and across a wide array of chronic disease areas. Since joining NACCHO, Ms. Ingoglia has also worked with the Capacities and Infrastructure, Primary Care, Rural Health, and Chronic Disease Prevention projects. Some of these activities focused on coalition development and maintenance, changing roles of LHDs, LHDs and community health center collaborations and access to and integration of care, and nutrition and physical activity programming at LHDs.
